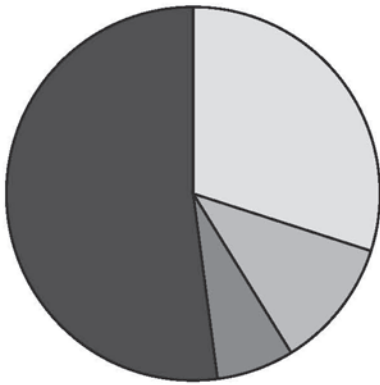

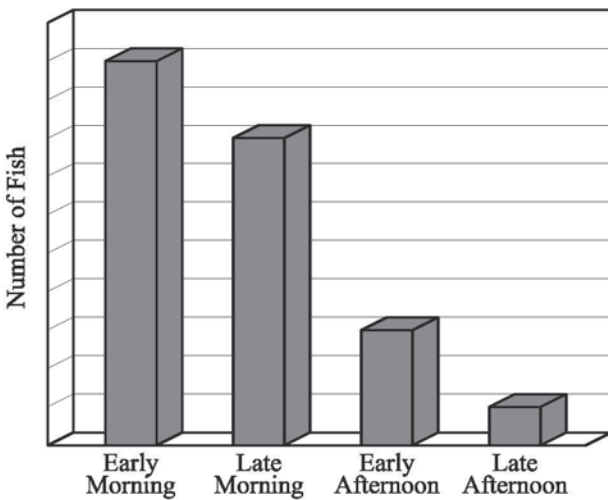

Camels in the United Arab Emirates

For a very long time, camels played a critical role in the deserts of the UAE. They provided the people of the desert with a means of transportation, food, and materials. In the past, camels were part of a family. They would carry heavy loads for a family. The hide was often used to make bags and other tools.

Although camels are still important culturally, the role of the camel has changed as life in the UAE has changed. Camels are no longer a primary means of transportation. They are still used for food, though. Typically, a camel can produce several litres of milk per day. Like other types of milk, camel milk is a good source of protein and vitamins. In addition, it doesn't cause the problems that other types of milk can. It is easier to digest than milk from other animals.

Camels also provide a great form of entertainment. Camel racing is a very popular sport. There are fifteen camel racing tracks in the UAE. Most races are on Thursdays and Saturdays during the winter months. There are thousands of racing camels in the UAE today.
